



DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in Region VI

as of 09 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

With confirmed cases and reports on the spread of the African Swine Fever (ASF) in Western Visayas (Region VI), the effects of ASF have placed the provinces of Aklan and Capiz as well as the municipality of Hamtic in Antique under the State of Calamity (SoC) on 19 May 2023, 13 June 2023, and 22 June 20223 respectively.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, where the mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages, or bacon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 22,416 families or 106,874 persons are affected in 447 barangays in Region VI (see Table 1).

27 June 2023	DSWD FO VI in coordination with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) of the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tangalan provided FFPs to the affected families.

c. Other Activities

9 August 2023	DSWD FO VI through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) coordinated with the affected LGUs through their respective Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) and other concerned offices for significant updates and any request for augmentation.
12 July 2023	DSWD FO VI in coordination with the LGU of Hamtic through its MSWDO facilitated the provision of Emergency Cash Transfer (ECT) to the affected families.
7 July 2023	DSWD FO VI in coordination with the MSWDO the LGU of Hamtic facilitated the provision of ECT to the affected families amounting to a total of ₱8,754,538.00.
