



DSWD DROMIC Report #13 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in Region VI

as of 15 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

With confirmed cases and reports on the spread of the African Swine Fever (ASF) in Western Visayas (Region VI), the effects of ASF have placed the provinces of Aklan and Capiz as well as the municipality of Hamtic in Antique under the State of Calamity (SoC) on 19 May 2023, 13 June 2023, and 22 June 20223 respectively.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, where the mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages, or bacon.

A total of **25,215 families** or **119,680 persons** are affected in **499 barangays** in **Region VI** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

29 July 2023	DSWD FO VI facilitated the release of additional FFPs to the affected families in Panitan, Capiz.
20 July 2023	DSWD FO VI facilitated the distribution of FFPs to the affected families in Panay, Capiz.
27 June 2023	DSWD FO VI in coordination with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) of the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tangalan provided FFPs to the affected families.
