

## DSWD DROMIC Report #18 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Egay” as of 07 August 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 27 July 2023, “Egay” maintained its strength as it moved West Northwestward and exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

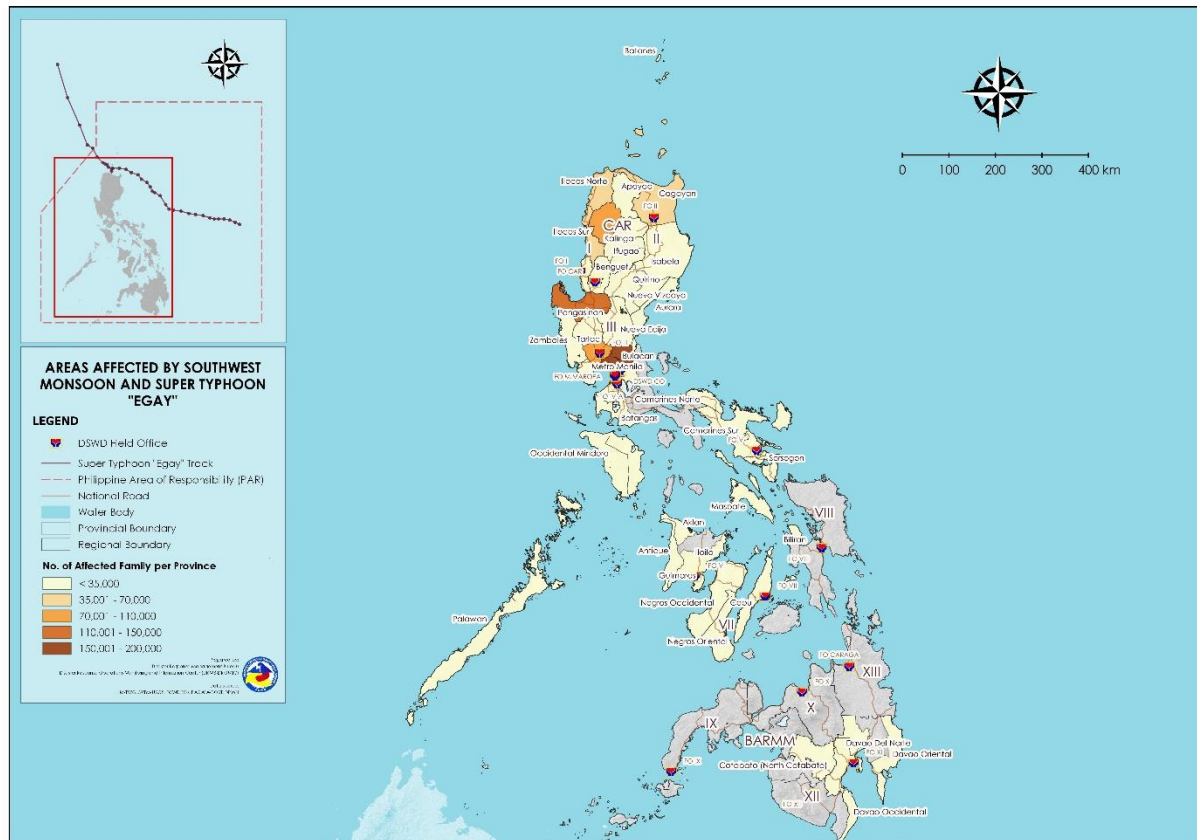

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **7,756 families** or **28,164 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **425 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, III, CALABARZON, VI, XII, NCR, and CAR** (see Table 2).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱315,806,560.27** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱264,954,240.81** from **DSWD**, **₱48,620,663.26** from **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱139,179.11** from **Non-Government Organizations**, and **₱2,092,477.09** from the **other Partners** (see Table 6).
