

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon “Goring” as of 29 August 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 27 August 2023 at 11PM, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) reported that the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon “Goring” may bring significant amount of rains to identified areas in the country within the next three days.

On the same day, several municipalities in the province of Occidental Mindoro and the municipality of San Enrique in Negros Occidental experienced flooding incidents due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon “Goring”.

On 28 August 2023, municipalities in the provinces of Batangas and Cavite have also reported the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon “Goring”.

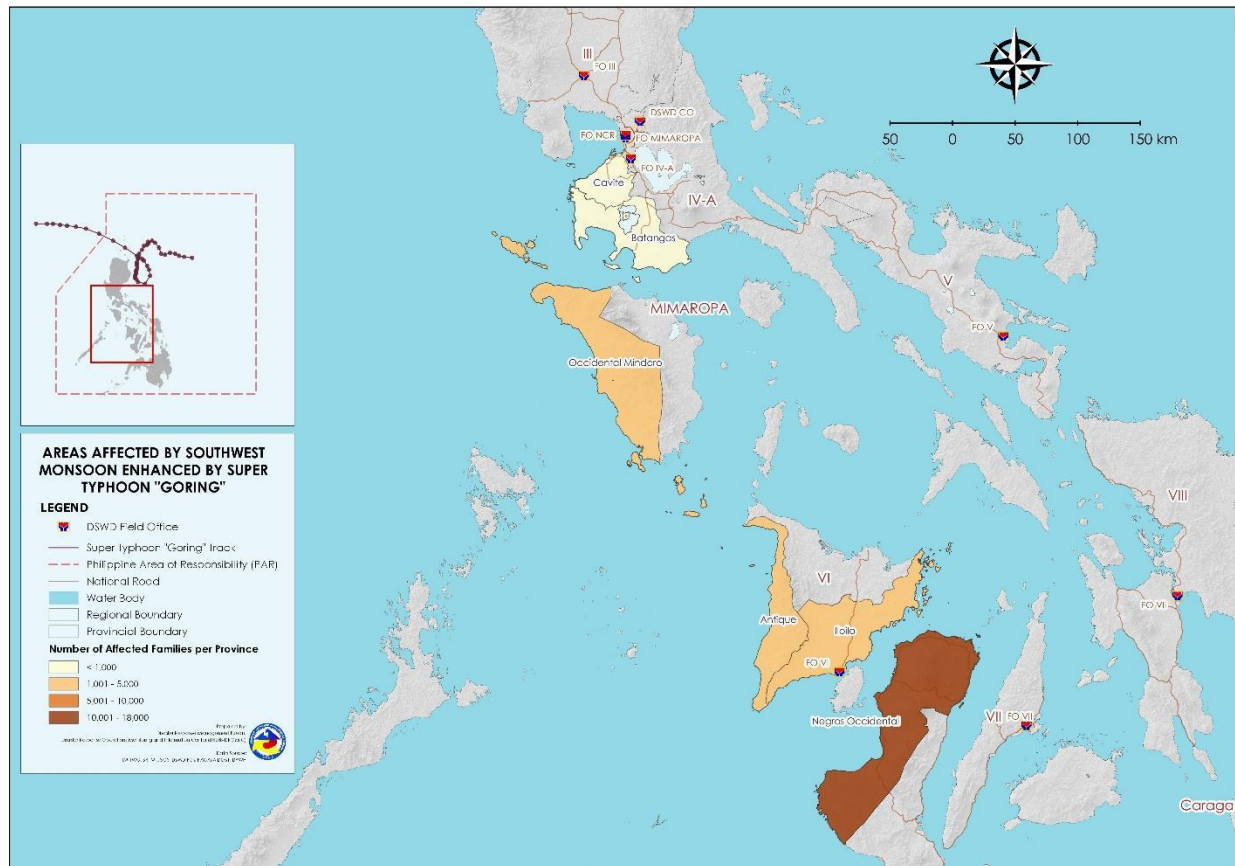
