

DSWD DROMIC Report #20 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Egay” as of 09 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 July 2023, “Egay” maintained its strength as it moved West Northwestward and exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

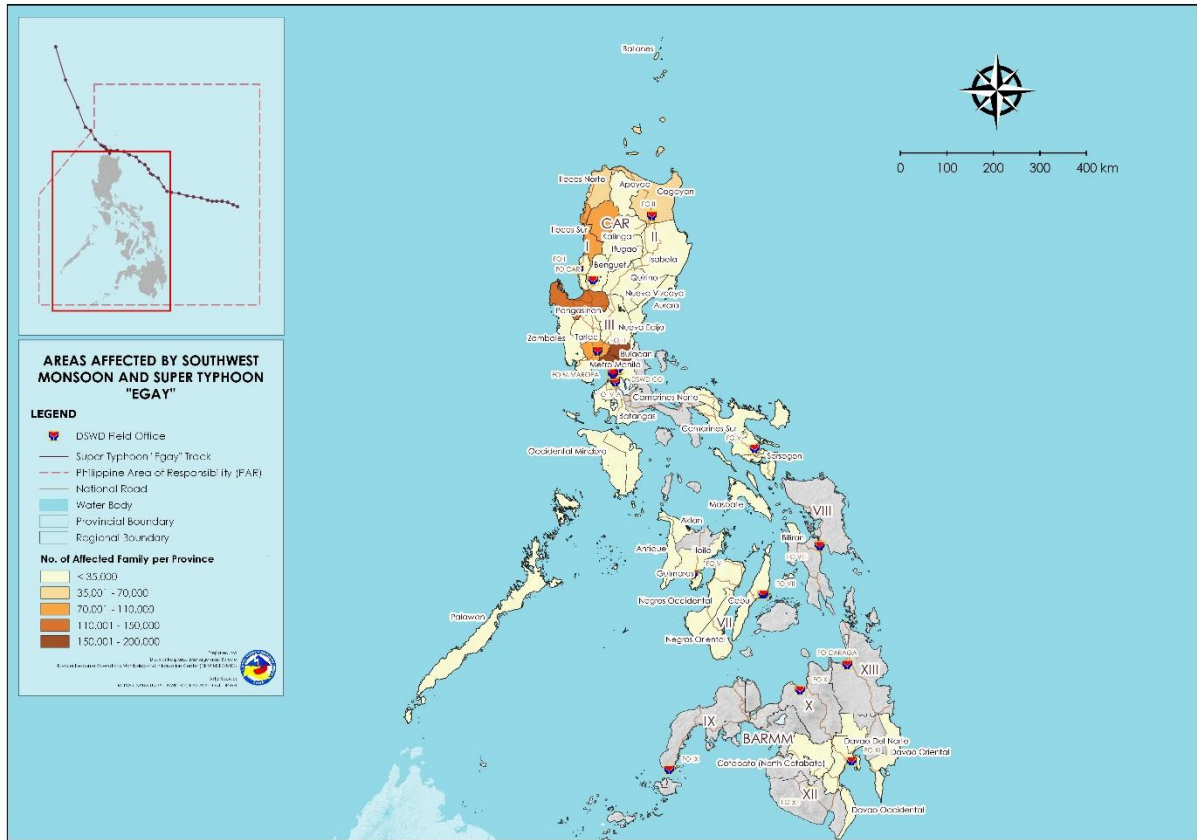

There are **6,324 families** or **23,101 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **351 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, III, CALABARZON, VI, XII, NCR, and CAR** (see Table 2).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided
