

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 17 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 17 August 2023 at 4PM, the Southwest Monsoon continuously affects Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **3,072 families** or **14,822 persons** are affected in **36 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and BARMM** (see Table 1).

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **413 families** or **1,780 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **seven (7) evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA and IX** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱575.61 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱20 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- ₱59.03 million in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 93,028 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 4,316 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 88,712 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 190,699 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- 550,830 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.17 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
