

## DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 21 August 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 21 August 2023 at 4PM, the Southwest Monsoon continuously affects the western sections of Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

A total of **10,681 families** or **45,258 persons** are affected in **49 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, IX, XI, and BARMM** (see Table 1).

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **445 families** or **1,934 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **seven (7) evacuation centers** in **Regions IX and XI** (see Table 2).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱262.17 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱20 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- ₱59.03 million in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 106,428 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 22,806 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 83,622 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 189,752 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- 543,658 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.18 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
