# I. Situation Overview

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱156.31 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱20 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- ₱59.03 million in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 108,472 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 30,005 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 78,467 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 189,758 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- 547,257 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.19 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
