I. Situation Overview

Issued on 24 August 2023 at 4PM, the Southwest Monsoon continuously affects Central and Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱156.31 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱20 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.





 ₱59.03 million in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 122,554 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 39,087 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 83,467 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 180,193 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XII.
- 529,852 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.19 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
