

## DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Region XII

as of 22 August 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Starting on 02 July 2023 4PM, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) reported that the easterlies had affected several parts of the country.

On 03 July 2023, the Municipality of Tantangan, South Cotabato experienced flash floods due to heavy rains caused by the said weather disturbance. On 05 July 2023, several low-lying barangays in the Municipalities of President Roxas and Kabacan in North Cotabato reported incidents of flash flood also caused by heavy rains brought by the easterlies.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,135 families** or **10,447 persons** are affected in **14 barangays** in **Region XII** (see Table 1).
