



# **DSWD DROMIC Report #64 on the Mayon Volcanic Activity**

as of 16 August 2023, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

- As of **16 August 2023** at **8AM**, **Alert Level 3** is maintained over Mayon Volcano, which means that it is currently in a relatively high level of unrest and hazardous eruption within weeks or even days could still be possible
- In the past 24-hour period, slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed the established lava flows on the Bonga (southeastern), Mi-isi (south), and Basud (eastern) gullies. The lava flows have maintained their respective advances to approximately 3.4 kilometers, 2.8 kilometers, and 1.1 kilometers from the crater. Rockfall generated by collapses of the lava flow margins as well as of the summit dome deposited debris still within four (4) kilometers of the crater. The Mayon Volcano Network recorded a total of one hundred seventy-five (175) volcanic earthquakes including ninety-six (96) tremor events lasting one (1) to twenty-one (21) minutes. Some of these tremors were accompanied by rumbling sounds audible within the 7-km radius from the crater of Mayon. Additionally, the network detected sixty (60) rockfall events and six (6) PDCs. Volcanic sulfur dioxide (SO2) emission averaged 1,113 tonnes/day on 15 August 2023. Short-term observations from electronic tilt and GPS monitoring indicate inflation of middle flanks since the third week of July 2023. Longer-term ground deformation parameters from EDM, precise leveling, continuous GPS, and electronic tilt monitoring indicate that Mayon is still generally inflated relative to baseline levels.
- It is therefore recommended that the 6-km radius Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ) remain evacuated due to the danger of PDCs, lava flows, rockfalls, and other volcanic hazards. Increased vigilance against pyroclastic density currents, lahars, and sediment-laden streamflows along channels draining the edifice is also advised. Heavy rainfall could generate channel-confined lahars and sediment-laden streamflows in channels where PDC deposits were emplaced.
- Civil aviation authorities must also advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit as ash from any sudden eruption can be hazardous to aircraft. Based on the current prevailing wind pattern, ash fall events may most likely occur on the south side of the volcano. DOST-PHIVOLCS maintains close monitoring of Mayon Volcano and any new development will be communicated to all concerned stakeholders.



# **IV.** Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱167,277,410.10 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱112,489,019.44 from DSWD, ₱4,224,362.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), ₱26,061,731.47 from the Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and ₱24,502,297.19 from other Partners (see Table 5).
