



DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on theFlash Flood Incidents in Misamis Oriental

as of 14 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 21 July 2023, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) local weather forecast advisory indicated that Northern Mindanao will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers or thunderstorms due to Southwest Monsoon / Localized Thunderstorms and will bring light to moderate winds from southwest to west with slight to moderate seas. This weather condition may have caused possible flash floods or landslides.

On the same day, the City of Cagayan de Oro and the Municipality of Tagoloan in Misamis Oriental experienced flash floods prompting forced evacuation in the affected areas.

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **141 families** or **526 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Misamis Oriental** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱274.11 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱4.2 million available at DSWD FO X.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 96,005 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 3,893 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City, and 92,112 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 40,124 FFPs available at DSWD FO X.
- ₱321.86 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO X warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

05 August 2023	 DSWD FO X delivered Family Food Packs (FFPs) to the affected families in Lala, Lanao Del Norte.
04 August 2023	DSWD FO X delivered additional FFPs to the LGU of Kinoguitan, Misamis Oriental.
01 August 2023	DSWD FO X provided 900 FFPs to the affected families in Kinoguitan, Misamis Oriental.
27 July 2023	The Local Government Units (LGU) of Kinoguitan also provided immediate relief assistance to the affected families.
21 July 2023	The LGU of Tagoloan provided immediate relief assistance to the affected families.
