



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Sipalay City, Negros Occidental

as of 17 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 September 2023 at around 5PM, an armed conflict transpired in Brgy. Gil Montilla, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental between the Philippine Army's 15th Infantry Battalion and members of the Communist Party of the Philippines-New People's Army (CPP-NPA) that also affected a nearby village of Brgy. San Jose also in Sipalay City. Source: DSWD Field Office (FO) VI and Philippine News Agency (PNA)

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **47 families** or **186 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Sipalay City, Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **39 families** or **153 persons** sought temporary shelter in **three (3)** evacuation centers in Sipalay City, Negros Occidental (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱18.57 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 147,762 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 91,261 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 56,501 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 17,373 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱300 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
