

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Mandaue City, Cebu as of 13 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 September 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms were experienced in Mandaue City, Cebu and caused flash floods and landslides in the area.
