I. Situation Overview

On 11 September 2023 at around 4:20 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. 43-B, Tacloban City. The fire was declared out at around 5:45 PM.

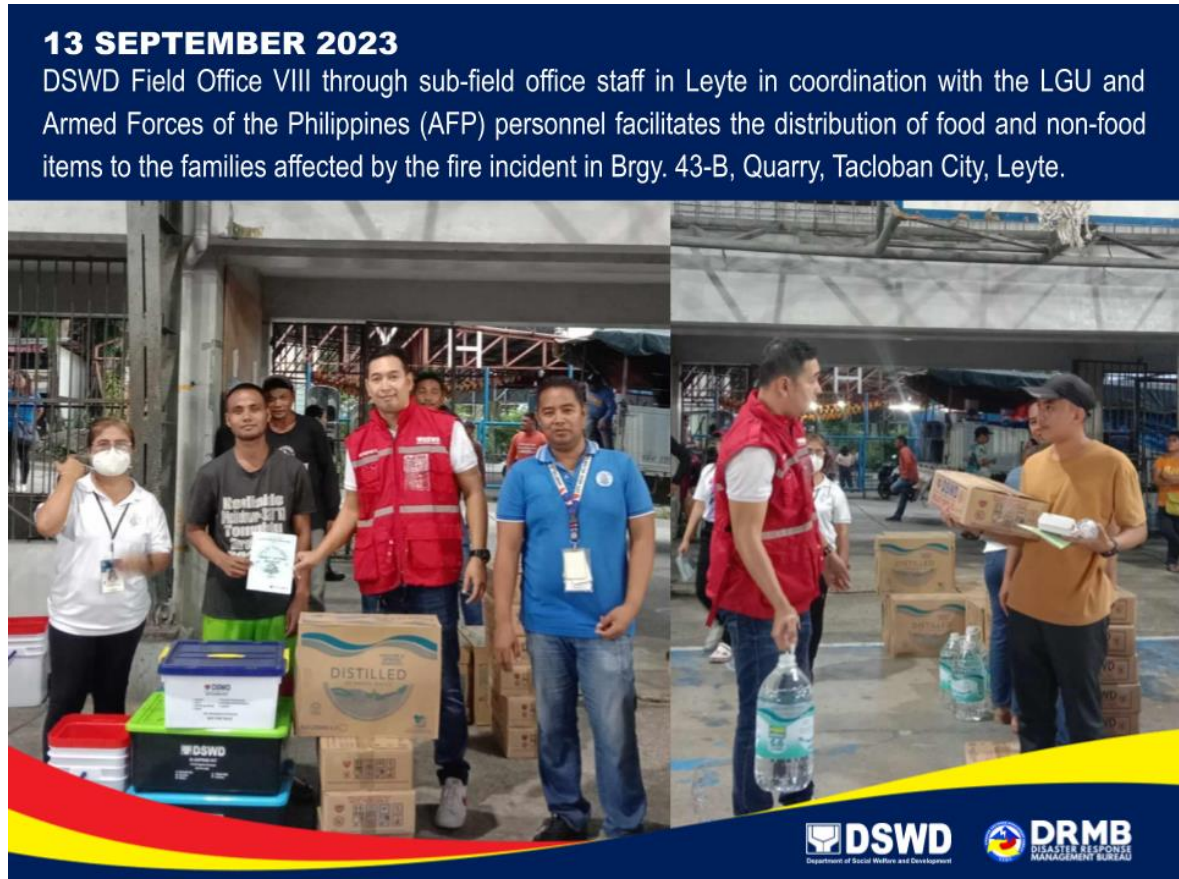
