

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Catmon, Cebu

as of 27 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 22 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the Low-Pressure Area (LPA) / Southwest Monsoon brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Metro Manila, the rest of Luzon, Visayas, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, and Zamboanga Peninsula.

On the same day at around 2:00 PM, a flooding incident occurred in Catmon, Cebu due to heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

A total of **87 families** or **342 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Catmon, Cebu** (see Table 1).
