



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Western Visayas

as of 23 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 22 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by Low Pressure Area (LPA) / Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Metro Manila, the rest of Luzon, Visayas, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, and the Zamboanga Peninsula.

On the same day at around 3PM, several barangays in the Municipalities of Dumarao, Capiz and Hinoba-an, Negros Occidental experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

There are 109 families or 387 persons currently taking temporary shelter in three (3) evacuation centers in Hinoba-an, Negros Occidental (see Table 2).
