



# **DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incidents in Cebu**

as of 25 September 2023, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 20 September 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by either the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) or localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 10:30 PM, several barangays in the Municipality of Compostela and Danao City in Cebu experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall brought by localized thunderstorms.
