



DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon

as of 19 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 August 202, the Municipality of Sablayan in Occidental Mindoro and the Municipality of Pandag in Maguindanao experienced flooding due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon.

On 11 August 2023, several municipalities in Western Visayas started to report the effects of Southwest Monsoon.

On 12 August 2023, several barangays in Zamboanga City also experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rains caused by Southwest Monsoon.

On 20 August 2023, the Davao Region also started reporting incidents of flooding and flash flood in the provinces of Davao del Norte, Davao Oriental, and Davao Occidental due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **25,771 families** or **117,462 persons** are affected in **106 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **VI**, **IX**, **XI**, and **BARMM** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of 1,293 families or 5,860 persons sought temporary shelter in 18 evacuation centers in Regions MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and XI (see Table 2).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}20,143,909.41\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}10,653,363.03\$ from \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}9,490,546.38\$ from the Local Government Unit (LGUs) (see Table 6).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱5.49 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱25 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, XI, and XII.
- ₱55.09 million in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 156,595 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 119,479 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City, and 37,116 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 198,284 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, IX, XI, and XII.
- 580,721 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.07 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
