



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Western Visayas

as of 27 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 22 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the Low-Pressure Area (LPA) / Southwest Monsoon brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Metro Manila, the rest of Luzon, Visayas, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, and the Zamboanga Peninsula.

On the same day at around 3:00 PM, several areas in Region VI (Western Visayas) experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.
