

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Red Tide Toxin in the Coastal Waters of Western Visayas

as of 15 September 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 22 August 2023, several municipalities in the Province of Iloilo reported cases of suspected paralytic shellfish poisoning (PSP).

In the Shellfish Bulletin No. 20 released on 26 August 2023, the Department of Agriculture (DA) through the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) advised that shellfishes collected and tested from coastal waters of Dauis and Tagbilaran City in Bohol; and Dumanquillas Bay in Zamboanga del Sur remain positive for PSP or toxic red tide that is beyond the regulatory limit. Moreover, Saplan Bay (Ivisan and Sapián in Capiz; and, Brgys. Mambuquio and Camanci, Batán in Aklan); coastal waters of Panay; President Roxas and Roxas City in Capiz; coastal waters of Gigantes Islands, Carles in Iloilo; and coastal waters of Altavas, Batán and New Washington in Batán Bay, Aklan were also positive for PSP.

According to the Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) of the affected LGUs, the effects of red tide have impacted the livelihood of the families/persons in the said areas.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,846 families** or **11,295 persons** are affected in **58 barangays** in **Western Visayas** (see Table 1).
