## **DSWD DROMIC Report #22 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon “Goring”, Typhoon “Hanna”, and Tropical Depression “Ineng”**

as of 27 September 2023, 6PM

### **I. Situation Overview**

On 24 August 2023 at 3AM, the center of Tropical Depression “Goring” was estimated based on all available data at 400 km East Northeast of Aparri, Cagayan (19.2°N, 125.3°E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h.

Issued on 27 August 2023 at 11PM, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) reported that the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Cyclone “Goring” may bring significant amount of rains to identified areas in the country within the next three days. On the same day, several municipalities in the Province of Occidental Mindoro and the Municipality of San Enrique in Negros Occidental experienced flooding due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by “Goring”.

On 28 August 2023, municipalities in the Provinces of Batangas and Cavite, and other Regions have reported effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by the said tropical cyclone. “Goring” slightly intensified while moving West Northwestward and became a typhoon on 29 August 2023. It continued to maintain its strength as it approached the Northwestern Boundary of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and reached the category of Super Typhoon on 30 August 2023.

The Southwest Monsoon continued to affect the country as “Hanna” accelerated while moving Westward over the Philippine Sea on 31 August 2023. “Hanna” continued to intensify as it accelerated West Northwestward towards the sea East of Taiwan. It became a typhoon on 03 September 2023 at 5PM and made landfall over Taitung County, Taiwan. Typhoon “Hanna” exited PAR on 04 September 2023.

On 04 September 2023, another Low-Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated on all available data at 870 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon. It became a Tropical Depression and was named “Ineng” on 05 September 2023 while moving Northeastward at 20 km/h. “Ineng” exited the PAR on 06 September 2023.

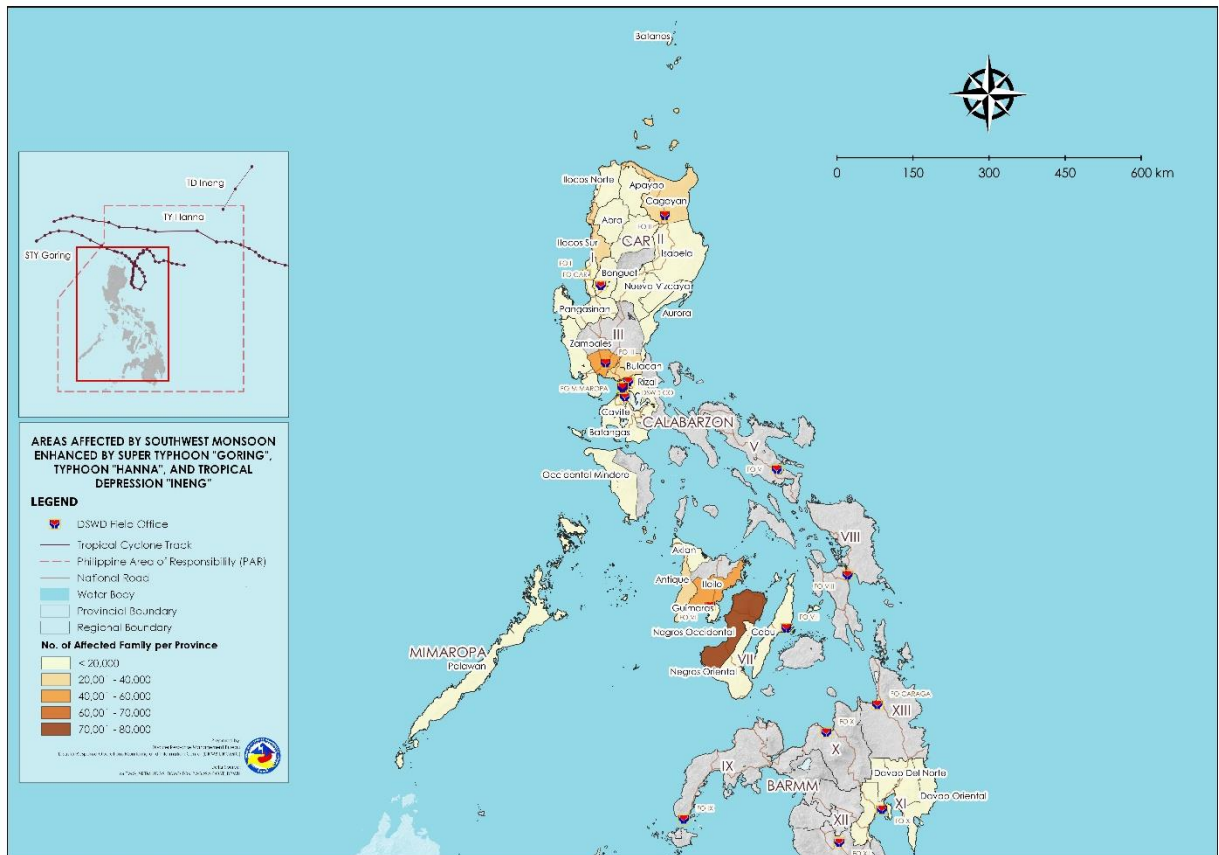
