



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Armed Conflict in Lambunao, Iloilo

as of 29 September 2023, 6PM

Ι. Situation Overview

On 19 September 2023 at around 6:30 AM, an armed conflict transpired between the troops of the Philippine Army's 82nd Infantry Battalion (IB) and members of the Communist Party of the Philippines – New People's Army (CPP-NPA) in Lambunao, Iloilo. According to reports, the said encounter initially transpired at Sitio Agdalusan, Brgy. Jayubo and has eventually affected nearby barangays during the follow-up operations conducted by the Philippine Army.

1. Standby Funds
