



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 20 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) that may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao Area.

On the same day, low-lying barangays in Zamboanga City and several municipalities in Davao Region and SOCCSKSARGEN experienced incidents of flooding and flash floods due to the effects of ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **42,382 families** or **208,094 persons** are affected in **116 barangays** in **Regions IX, XI, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Table 1).

- ₱5.49 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱15 million available at DSWD FOs IX, XI, and XII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 156,275 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 119,159 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City, and 37,116 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 116,397 FFPs available at DSWDs FO IX, XI, and XII.
- ₱1.07 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs warehouses.

19 September 2023	 The LGU of Pigcawayan through its MSWDO distributed Modular Tents, Hygiene Kits, Sleeping Kits, Pairs of Slippers and served hot meals to the displaced families in different designated evacuation centers. The BDRRMC of Tinago together with the MDRRMC of Norala provided hot meals to the displaced families and persons.
17 September 2023	The LGU of Tupi provided hot meals to the affected families.
