

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon in Western Visayas

as of 29 September 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 22 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the Low-Pressure Area (LPA) / Southwest Monsoon brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Metro Manila, the rest of Luzon, Visayas, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, and the Zamboanga Peninsula.

On the same day at around 3PM, several areas in Western Visayas experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

On 28 September 2023, the Provinces of Antique, Capiz, Iloilo, Guimaras, and Negros Occidental reported incidents of flooding, flash flood, and landslides caused by continuous heavy rainfall brought by the prevailing Southwest Monsoon.
