

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Davao Region

as of 19 September 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 08 September 2023 at around 11PM, a flash flood incident occurred in Brgy. Concepcion Asuncion, Davao del Norte due to localized thunderstorms.

On 14 September 2023, several more municipalities in the provinces of Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, and Davao Occidental also experienced flash floods due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon / Localized Thunderstorms.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **10,039 families** or **41,357 persons** are affected in **29 barangays** in **Region XI** (see Table 1).
