



DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 21 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) that may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao Area.

On the same day, low-lying barangays in Zamboanga City and several municipalities in Davao Region and SOCCSKSARGEN experienced incidents of flooding and flash floods due to the effects of ITCZ.

Issued on 21 September 2023 at 4PM, the ITCZ continuously affects Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱5.49 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱15 million available at DSWD FOs IX, XI, and XII.
- ₱65.09 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

• 137,587 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 93,371 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City,





and 44,216 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.

- 93,476 FFPs available at DSWDs FO IX, XI, and XII.
- 662,399 FFPs in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.11 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food items (FNIs)

21 September 2023	 DSWD FO XII distributed FNIs to the affected families and individuals in the Municipalities of Lambayong, Sultan Kudarat; Norala, South Cotabato; Shariff Aguak, Maguindanao del Sur, and Datu Hoffer Ampatuan, Maguindanao del Sur.
20 September 2023	 DSWD FO XII distributed FFPs to the affected families and individuals in the Municipalities of Pigcawayan, North Cotabato and Lambayong, Sultan Kudarat.
19 September 2023	 The LGU of Pigcawayan through its MSWDO distributed Modular Tents, Hygiene Kits, Sleeping Kits, Pairs of Slippers and served hot meals to the displaced families and individuals in different designated evacuation centers. The BDRRMC of Tinago together with the MDRRMC of Norala provided hot meals to the displaced families and individuals.
17 September 2023	The LGU of Tupi provided hot meals to the affected families and individuals.
