

## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 22 September 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 17 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) that may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao Area.

On the same day, low-lying barangays in Zamboanga City and several municipalities in Davao Region, SOCCSKSARGEN, and BARMM experienced incidents of flooding and flash floods due to the effects of ITCZ.

There are **157 families** or **650 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **six (6) evacuation centers** in **Region XI** and **XII** (see Table 2).
