



DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 24 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) that may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao Area. On the same day, low-lying barangays in Zamboanga City and several municipalities in Davao Region, SOCCSKSARGEN, and BARMM experienced incidents of flooding and flash flood due to the ITCZ.

On 22 September 2023, several barangays in the Municipality of Barotac Viejo in Iloilo also experienced flooding caused by the ITCZ.



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 233 families or 953 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 10 evacuation centers in Regions VI, XI, and XII (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱5.49 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱20 million available at DSWD FOs VI, IX, XI, and XII.
- ₱60.09 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.


