

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Maguindanao del Sur as of 07 October 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 18 September 2023 at around 4:00 AM, an armed conflict transpired on Brgy. Kaya-kaya, Datu Abdullah Sangki in Maguindanao del Sur that also affected several nearby areas and resulted in the displacement of families and persons.

According to reports, the armed encounter was a “rido” (clan war) involving two leaders of the Moro Islamic Liberation Front’s (MILF) 106th Command in the villages of Kaya-Kaya and Tukanalugong.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **3,922 families** or **19,610 persons** are affected in **eight (8) barangays** in **Maguindanao del Sur** (see Table 1).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **1,009 families** or **5,045 persons** sought temporary shelter in **13 evacuation centers** in **Maguindanao del Sur** (see Table 2).
