



DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 18 October 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 September 2023, cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) that may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao Area. On the same day, low-lying barangays in Zamboanga City and several municipalities in Davao Region, SOCCSKSARGEN, and BARMM experienced incidents of flooding and flash flood due to the ITCZ.

On 18 September 2023, a landslide incident occurred in Brgy. Lipol, Sarangani, Davao Occidental due to the effects of ITCZ. On 21 September 2023, flash flood incidents in several coastal barangays and landslides in upland barangays were also reported in Sta. Cruz, Davao del Sur.

On 22 September 2023, several barangays in the Municipality of Barotac Viejo in Iloilo also experienced flooding caused by the ITCZ.



A total of ₱29,004,705.14 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱28,789,205.14 from DSWD, ₱120,500.00 from a Local Government Unit (LGU), and ₱95,000.00 was provided by the Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Table 4).
