I. Situation Overview

On 02 October 2023 at around 12:28 PM, a fire incident occurred at 11th Avenue, Brgy. 90, Caloocan City. The fire was declared out at around 1:39 PM.

1. Standby Funds

- 117,250 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 74,882 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 42,368 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 8,269 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱434.24 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
