

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of the Trough of Low Pressure Area as of 26 November 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

From 08 to 11 October 2023 at 4PM, the trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) generally affected Visayas and Mindanao.

On 09 October 2023, a flash flood incident occurred in the Municipality of Sibalom, Antique due to heavy rains. The next day, the effects of the trough of LPA were reported in the Municipalities of San Enrique and Barotac Viejo in Iloilo, and Cauayan in Negros Occidental. Flooding was also experienced in several barangays in the Municipality of Bansalan in Davao del Sur.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,605 families** or **10,332 persons** are affected in **31 barangays** in **Regions VI and XI** (see Table 1).

A total of **63 families** or **295 persons** sought temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **San Enrique, Iloilo** (see Table 2).
