

## DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Camiguin

as of 08 November 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 September 2023 at 4AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon / localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day, the Municipalities of Mahinog and Sagay in Camiguin experienced flash floods due to heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

A total of **109 families** or **450 persons** are affected in **five (5) barangays** in **Camiguin** (see Table 1).

A total of **98 families** or **401 persons** sought temporary shelter at the **Municipal Gym** in **Mahinog, Camiguin** (see Table 2).
