



DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in MIMAROPA

as of 26 October 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 03 October 2023, several confirmed cases were reported on the spread of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Romblon. The Municipality of San Fernando, Romblon was declared under State of Calamity (SoC) on 04 October 2023 in response to a surge in hog fatalities as reported by their Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO). The Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro has also declared the Municipalities of Mansalay, Cajidiocan, and Roxas under SOC.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, whose mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages or bacon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,909 families** or **9,545 persons** are affected in **45 barangays** in **MIMAROPA** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 103,616 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 87,848 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 15,768 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 70,876 FFPs available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.
- ₱657.5 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO MIMAROPA warehouses.
