

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Mamasapano, Maguindanao del Sur

as of 12 November 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 07 November 2023, an armed conflict transpired in Brgy. Tukanalipao, Mamasapano, Maguindanao del Sur between a group belonging to the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) and an unidentified armed group that resulted in the displacement of families and persons

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **840 families** or **4,200 persons** are affected in **Mamasapano, Maguindanao del Sur** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **80 families** or **400 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Tuka Elementary School** in **Mamasapano, Maguindanao del Sur** (see Table 2).

- 142,470 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 107,302 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 35,168 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 58,647 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
