



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Brgy. Ma-ao, Bago City, Negros Occidental

as of 06 November 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 20 October 2023 at 4PM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains caused by localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 1:10 PM, isolated rainshowers with lightning strikes were experienced in Brgy. Ma-ao, Bago City, Negros Occidental due to localized thunderstorms that resulted in the demise of an individual.
