### I. Situation Overview

- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 135,970 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 107,302 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 28,668 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 51,403 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱1.03 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.

09 November 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• From 07 to 09 November 2023, DSWD FO CALABARZON distributed FNIs to the affected families and individuals who were staying in evacuation center.</li> <li>• DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office of the Provincial Government of Laguna for the hauling of the remaining allocated FNIs at the warehouses in Dasmariñas City and General Mariano Alvarez, Cavite intended for distribution to the affected families and individuals.</li> </ul>

**c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)**

09 November 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DSWD FO CALABARZON through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) visited the evacuation center in Brgy. Caingin, Sta. Rosa City to assess the situation of the displaced families and individuals, and provided technical assistance to the LGU.</li> </ul>
07 November 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The City Action Team (CAT) of DSWD FO CALABARZON were requested to closely coordinate with the locality, monitor the situation, and provide updates to the Emergency Operations Center (EOC).</li> <li>The Quick Response Team (QRT) members of DSWD FO CALABARZON who are trained on CCCM and Internally Displaced Person (IDP) Protection, Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA), and Psychosocial First Aid (PFA) were placed on alert status for possible deployment.</li> </ul>
