



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Midsayap, North Cotabato

as of 06 November 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 03 November 2023 at 4AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 5PM, low-lying barangays in the Municipality of Midsayap, North Cotabato experienced flooding due to localized thunderstorms.

A total of 1,126 families or 5,571 persons are affected in seven (7) barangays in Midsayap, North Cotabato (see Table 1).
