





DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) and Shear Line

as of 20 November 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 November 2023, a landslide incident occurred in Brgy. Pong-on, Bontoc in the Province of Southern Leyte due to the effects of LPA and Shear Line.

On 17 November 2023, the effects of LPA and Shear Line were also reported in the Municipalities of Magarao, Camarines Sur, and San Miguel, Catanduanes.

Issued on 20 November 2023 at 4:00 PM, the Shear Line continuously affects the eastern section of Visayas while the Northeast Monsoon continuously affects Luzon.




Figure 1. Areas affected by LPA and Shear Line

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 26,670 families or 91,219 persons are affected in 125 barangays in Regions V and VIII (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 45 families or 201 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 11 evacuation centers in Region VIII (see Annex B): of which, one (1) is a male toddler, one (1) is a male preschooler, three (3) are of school age (male:1 &







female:2), one (1) is a male teenager, nine (9) are adults (male:4 & female:5), and three (3) are senior citizens (male:1 & female:2) (see Annex C).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **2,508 families** or **9,091 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives and/or friends in **Region VIII** (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 2,553 families or 9,292 persons displaced in Region VIII (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **six (6) houses** were **partially damaged** in **Bontoc**, **Southern Leyte** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱1,482,394.60 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱ 1,481,434.60 from DSWD and ₱960.00 from Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex G).

20 November 2023	 DRMB closely coordinated with DOST-PAGASA for significant weather updates and other related information relative to the LPA and Shear Line. All DRMB Quick Response Team (QRT) members and emergency equipment were on standby and ready for deployment. NRLMB ensured the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises. NRLMB continuously repacked goods for possible augmentation.

18 November 2023	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA issued a memorandum for the activation of the on-call status of QRTs on the possible effects of LPA and Shear Line. DSWD FO MIMAROPA maintained monitoring of daily local weather conditions through bulletins, warnings, and other advisories issued by DOST-PAGASA, DENR-MGB, and other surveillance agencies. 			
16 November 2023	DSWD FO MIMAROPA attended the Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting.			
15 November 2023	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA alerted the Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) Team Offices to monitor daily local weather conditions and related eventualities, and ensure the provision of information to all concerned offices, divisions, sections, and units. DSWD FO MIMAROPA's expanded QRTs were placed on on-call status together with special projects staff on a 24/7 basis for possible activation of the Operations Center to respond in case of any untoward incidents and eventualities are reported. The Information and Communications Technology Management Section (ICTMS) of DSWD FO MIMAROPA remained on standby to ensure the availability of a robust communication system. DSWD FO MIMAROPA closely coordinated with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) and Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) MIMAROPA to monitor the areas that may be affected by the weather disturbance, establish response mechanisms, and gather other related updates.

DSWD FO VII through its DRMD-Disaster Response Information Management Section (DRIMS) maintained close monitoring of the latest weather updates and coordinated with Provincial/City/Municipal Action Teams (P/C/MATs) and other concerned offices for important information.
