

# DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) and Shear Line as of 21 November 2023, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 16 November 2023, a landslide incident occurred in Brgy. Pong-on, Bontoc in the Province of Southern Leyte due to the effects of LPA and Shear Line.

On 17 November 2023, the effects of LPA and Shear Line were also reported in the Municipalities of Magarao, Camarines Sur, and San Miguel, Catanduanes.

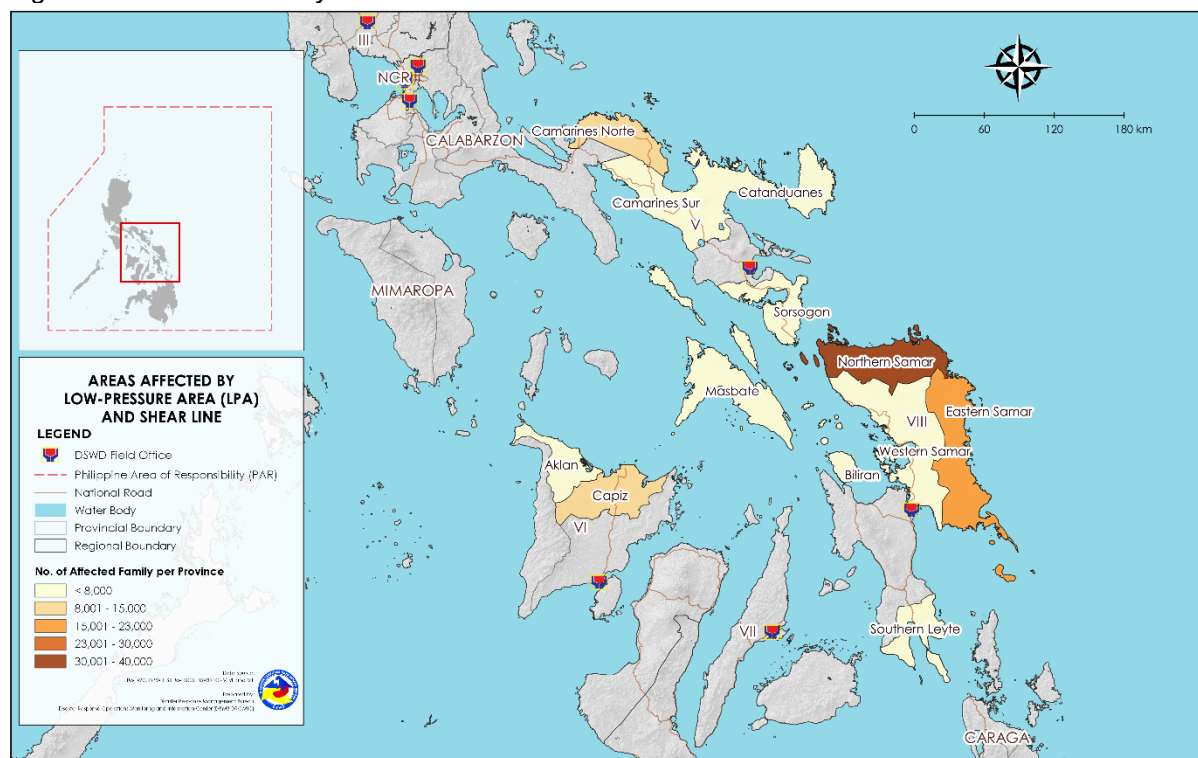
On 20 November 2023, several municipalities in the provinces of Aklan and Capiz experienced flooding due to the effects of Shear Line.

On 21 November 2023, the provinces of Camarines Norte, Masbate, and Sorsogon in the Bicol Region and the provinces of Biliran, Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, Western Samar, and Southern Leyte in Eastern Visayas have reported the effects of Shear Line.

Issued on 21 November 2023 at 4:00 PM, the Shear Line continuously affects the eastern section of Southern Luzon and Visayas while the Northeast Monsoon continuously affects the rest of Luzon.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **86,662 families** or **342,183 persons** are affected in **405 barangays** in **Regions V, VI** and **VIII** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **3,463 families** or **13,749 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **71 evacuation centers** in **Regions V, VI**, and **VIII** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **8,106 families** or **34,691 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives and/or friends in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **11,569 families** or **48,440 persons** displaced in **Regions V, VI**, and **VIII** (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **seven (7) houses** were **partially damaged** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,453,449.03** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱3,452,489.03** from **DSWD** and **₱960.00** from **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).
