





DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Camiguin

as of 22 November 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 September 2023 at 4AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers or thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsson / localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day, the Municipalities of Mahinog and Sagay in Camiguin experienced flash floods due to heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

A total of **98 families** or **398 persons** took temporary shelter at the **Municipal Gym** in **Mahinog**, **Camiguin** (see Table 2).
