





# **DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Easterlies**

as of 19 November 2023, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 07 November 2023, the effects of Easterlies were reported in Iligan City, Lanao del Norte after several barangays experienced flash flood and flooding. On the same day, flash flood in Brgy. Caridad, Lambayong, Sultan Kudarat and a rain-induced landslide along Sitio Lower Ladol, Brgy. Assumption, Koronadal City occurred due to the presence of the said weather disturbance.

On 08 November 2023, several barangays in Davao City also experienced flooding that resulted in the displacement of families and persons.

There are **35 families** or **140 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Region XI** (see Table 2).

- ₱10.45 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱14.2 million available at DSWD FOs X, XI, and XII.
- ₱65.9 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Easterlies through inter-FO augmentation.
