

DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Caingin, Sta. Rosa City, Laguna

23 December 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 December 2023 at around 3:00 PM, a fire incident transpired in Brgy. Caingin, Sta. Rosa City, Laguna. The City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) reported a total of 127 totally damaged houses and 187 families affected who took shelter at Southville IV covered court of the Barangay.

In response, the DSWD Field Office CALABARZON together with the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Sta. Rosa City, assessed the situation and promptly intervened to address the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals by providing Food and Non-Food Items (NFIs) and financial assistance.

Consequently, the LGU of Sta. Rosa City already managed the IDPs and is committed to continuously provide interventions as necessary hence, the termination of this report. Likewise, the FO maintains close coordination with CSWDO for possible request of technical assistance and resource augmentation

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **187 families** or **804 persons** were affected in **Brgy. Caingin, Sta. Rosa City, Laguna** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **104 families** or **428 persons** are still temporarily staying in at the **Southville Covered Court Phase 2, Brgy. Caingin evacuation center**. (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **127 houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. Caingin, Sta. Rosa City, Laguna** (see Annex C).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,804,232.20** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱1,264,232.20** were from **DSWD** and **₱2,540,000.00** were from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex D).
