

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Shear Line and Tropical Storm “Kabayan” as of 18 December 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 18 December 2023 at 5PM, “Kabayan” weakens into a remnant low.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

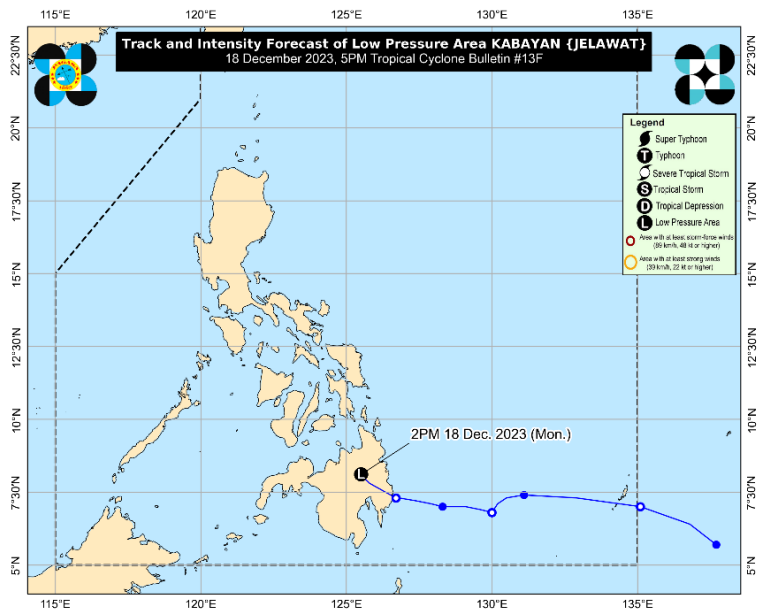
- Forecast accumulated rainfall for today to tomorrow afternoon
 - 100-200 mm: Surigao del Sur, Surigao del Norte, Dinagat Islands, Agusan del Sur, Davao del Norte, Davao de Oro, and Davao Oriental.
 - 50-100 mm: Central Visayas, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Zamboanga del Norte, Northern Mindanao, Davao City, Cotabato, Lanao del Sur, the southern portions of Samar and Eastern Samar, and the rest of Caraga, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, and Davao del Norte.
- Forecast accumulated rainfall from tomorrow afternoon to Wednesday afternoon
 - 50-100 mm: Mainland Palawan, Cuyo Islands, Cagayancillo Islands, and Kalayaan Islands

Forecast rainfall are generally higher in elevated or mountainous areas. Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are likely especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in localities that experienced considerable amounts of rainfall for the past several days.

In addition, the Shear Line coinciding with the passage of the remnants of “Kabayan” may bring heavy rainfall over the eastern portion of Southern Luzon.

Severe Winds

- The surge of the Northeast Monsoon will bring gusty conditions for the next 2 days over the following areas, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:
 - Today and Tomorrow: Most of Luzon and Visayas



HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Under the influence of the Northeast Monsoon surge, a Gale Warning is in effect for the coastal waters along the seaboard of Northern Luzon, the eastern and central seaboards of Visayas, and the eastern seaboards of Central Luzon, Southern Luzon, and Mindanao. Sea travel is risky for small seacraft (including all motor bancas of any type or tonnage). Mariners of these vessels are advised to remain in port or seek safe harbor.

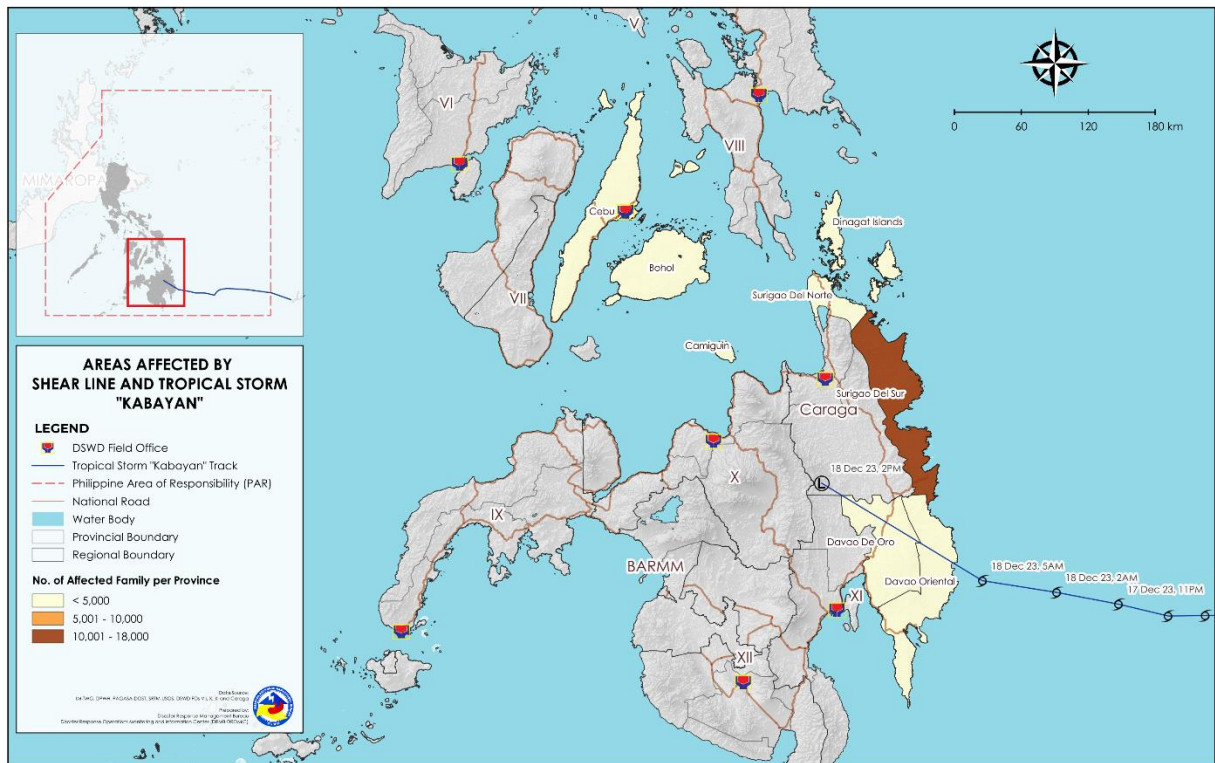
Outside the coastal waters under Gale Warning, moderate to rough seas are likely over the western seaboards of Central (1.5-3.5 m) and Southern Luzon, the western and northern seaboards of Mindanao, and the remaining seaboard of Visayas (1.25-3.0 m). Mariners of motor bancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- “Kabayan” weakened into a Low Pressure Area at 2:30 PM today. The remnant circulation of “Kabayan” is forecast to track generally northwestward or west northwestward traversing the Philippine archipelago over the next two days as it remains highly disorganized. On the track forecast, “Kabayan” will continue to cross the rugged terrain of Mindanao, and emerge over the Sulu Sea between this afternoon and evening. Afterwards, a slight improvement in the environmental conditions may allow this disturbance to reorganize and re-develop into a tropical depression.
- Afterwards, “Kabayan” will move across the Sulu Sea south of Cagayancillo Islands. “Kabayan” is forecast to make another cross over central or southern Palawan by tomorrow morning or afternoon, then emerge over the West Philippine Sea shortly thereafter. It may pass near or over Kalayaan Islands between tomorrow evening and Wednesday morning.

The Low Pressure Area was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of Impasug-ong, Bukidnon (08.3 °N, 125.1 °E)

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **18,266 families** or **59,493 persons** are affected in **152 barangays** in **Regions VII, X, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **15,754 families** or **51,557 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **286 evacuation centers** in **Regions VII, X, XI and Caraga** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **2,113 families** or **6,872 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **17,867 families** or **58,429 persons** displaced in **Regions VII, X, XI and Caraga** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **17 houses** were damaged; of which, **three (3)** are **totally damaged** and **14** are **partially damaged** in **Regions X, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱5,000.00** worth of assistance was provided by the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).
