





DSWD DROMIC Report #28 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in MIMAROPA

as of 13 December 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 03 October 2023, several confirmed cases were reported on the spread of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Romblon. The Municipality of San Fernando, Romblon was placed under State of Calamity (SoC) on 04 October 2023 in response to a surge in hog fatalities as reported by their Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO). The Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro has also declared the Municipalities of Mansalay, Cajidiocan, and Roxas under SoC.

On 08 November 2023, the Province of Romblon was placed under SoC due to the continuously increasing number of ASF cases resulting in a major disruption of its local economy.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, whose mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages or bacon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **6,232 families** or **31,160 persons** are affected in **115 barangays** in **Region MIMAROPA** (see Annex A).

III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱10,286,075.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱7,992,700.00 from DSWD and ₱2,293,375.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex B).

- 64,415 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 34,423 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 29,992 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 87,114 FFPs available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.
- ₱1.14 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO MIMAROPA warehouses.

10 November 2023	DSWD FO MIMAROPA through the SWADT Office in Romblon provided financial assistance to the 903 affected hog raisers in the Municipality of Cajidiocan, Romblon.
09 November 2023	DSWD FO MIMAROPA through the SWADT Office in Romblon provided financial assistance to the 686 affected hog raisers in the Municipality of San Fernando, Romblon.
