





# DSWD DROMIC Report #32 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in MIMAROPA

as of 23 January 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 03 October 2023, several confirmed cases were reported on the spread of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Romblon. The Municipality of San Fernando, Romblon was placed under State of Calamity (SoC) on 04 October 2023 in response to a surge in hog fatalities as reported by their Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO). The Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro has also declared the Municipalities of Mansalay, Cajidiocan, and Roxas under SoC.

On 08 November 2023, the Province of Romblon was placed under SoC due to the continuously increasing number of ASF cases resulting in a major disruption of its local economy.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, whose mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages or bacon.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **7,561 families** or **37,805 persons** are affected in **158 barangays** in **Region MIMAROPA** (see Annex A).

### III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}19,879,975.00\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}15,972,600.00\$ from **DSWD** and \$\mathbb{P}3,907,375.00\$ from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex B).
