



DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Bombing Incident in Marawi City, Lanao del Sur

as of 23 January 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 03 December 2023, a bombing incident occurred at the gymnasium of Mindanao State University (MSU) in Marawi City, Lanao del Sur affecting several individuals from various municipalities.

In response, the DSWD through its Field Offices in Regions IX, X, and XII together with concerned LGUs and other offices promptly provided the immediate needs of the affected individuals through the provision of non-food items and financial assistance through the Assistance for Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS) as well Psychosocial Support Intervention.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **412 persons** are affected by the **Bombing Incident** in **Marawi, City, Lanao del Sur** (See Annex A).

III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱958,497.02 worth of assistance was provided by DSWD to the affected population; composed of ₱3,497.02 worth of non-food items and ₱955,000.00 financial assistance through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) (see Table 1).
