



# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Shear Line and Tropical Storm "Kabayan"

as of 21 December 2023, 6PM


## I. Situation Overview

On 17 December 2023, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Surigao del Sur developed into Tropical Depression "Kabayan". On the same day at 11PM, "Kabayan" intensified into a Tropical Storm.

On 18 December 2023, "Kabayan" weakened into a Tropical Depression and has made landfall over Manay, Davao Oriental. At 2:30 PM, "Kabayan" weakened into an LPA and at 5PM, "Kabayan" further weakend into a Remnant Low.

On 20 December 2023, the LPA (formerly "Kabayan") located at the West of Puerto Princesa, Palawan continued to move away. On 21 December 2023, the LPA (formerly "Kabayan") exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

In addition, the Shear Line that coincided with the passage of "Kabayan" brought significant amount of rains to several areas of the country.

## **II.** Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **105,247 families** or **388,884 persons** are affected in **470 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI,** and **Caraga** (see Annex A).

## **III.** Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 694 families or 2,413 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 14 evacuation centers in Regions MIMAROPA, VIII, XI and Caraga (see Annex B).

- b. Outside Evacuation Center There are three (3) families or eight (8) persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).
- c. Total Displaced Population
   There are 697 families or 2,421 persons displaced in Regions MIMAROPA, VIII, XI and Caraga (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,980 houses** were damaged; of which, **155** are **totally damaged** and **1,825** are **partially damaged** in **Regions X**, **XI**, and **Caraga** (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of DSWD Assistance Provided

A total of ₱ 11,369,908.36 worth of assistance was provided by DSWD to the affected families, all of which are food and non-food items (FNIs) (see Table 1).
