

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Sag-ang, La Castellana, Negros Occidental

as of 19 January 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 January 2024 at around 11:00 AM, an armed conflict transpired between the Philippine Army and members of the Communist Party of the Philippines-New People's Army (CPP-NPA) in Brgy. Sag-ang, La Castellana, Negros Occidental that resulted in the displacement of families and persons.

A total of **31 families** or **126 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Sag-ang, La Castellana, Negros Occidental** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **31 families** or **126 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Brgy. Sag-ang, La Castellana, Negros Occidental** (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱164,517.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex C).
